From the Desk of the Executive Director . . .

I am sorry to have to report that the moneychangers are still in the temple. Let me explain.

When Jesus overturned the vendors' tables in the Temple (Matthew 21:12,13), his chief complaint was that the profiteering vendors had turned a place of worship into a location where the poor were exploited and robbed. So, lets apply an analogy by looking at profiteering polluting industries which exploit the resources of the natural Temple of God's Creation (Earth). These industries make obscene profits while harming poor (often BIPOC and LatinX) communities living in "sacrifice zones" and by compromising the health of us all. Unfortunately, the EPA, and now the state of Delaware, are not in a position to do anything about this travesty.

New MAP and You

Methodist ACTION Program www.mapde.org

On Thursday, Delaware's Climate Solutions Act was not released from committee, despite at least a 6-1 public comment favoring the bill. EVERY ONE of the commenters who opposed the bill had a financial interest in maintaining the status quo. The pro-bill commenters pleaded for the well-being of marginalized communities and for the health and futures of their own children. There was even a child and two youth who spoke, asking the legislators to protect their futures from the effects of climate change. Yet, the committee members did not listen to the pleas of their constituents. Instead, they listened to the Chamber of Commerce and the state's polluting industries (utilities and the farming - mainly poultry - industries) who argued on procedure instead of substance. They falsely claimed that the bill was not well-crafted (It already had passed the Senate, so how was it not well-crafted?) and that it needed "work." A source close to me has confirmed that this is a legal "trick" - when one side does not have a substantive leg to stand on concerning the issues, they attack the opposing side with procedural arguments that are full of misinformation and half-truths but which can sound convincing.

In case you want to know, here is the record of the committee vote ("Yes" was a vote to allow the bill to go to the House floor for a whole-chamber hearing, debate, and vote):

Chair Rep. Heffernan (and bill sponsor) – Yes	Rep. Carson – No
Vice-chair Rep. Griffith – Yes	Rep. Bush – No
Rep. Lambert – Yes	Rep. Collins – No
Rep. Kowalko – Yes	Rep. Gray – No
Rep. Bentz – Yes	Rep. Postles - No
	Rep. Shupe - No

For those of you who are not familiar with the make-up of the committee (which I think is relevant in this case), Rep. Lambert is a Person of Color who grew up and lives in Claymont; he made an impassioned plea for his home constituents, many of whom suffer health effects from nearby polluting industries. Rep. Heffernan is a mom who pleaded for the generations of children who will increasingly suffer from climate change due main part to the greenhouse gasses that the bill would have reduced. Rev. Griffith also is a mom who is likewise concerned. Rep. Kowalko is a brave advocate for his constituents who formerly worked inside the fossil fuel industry and gave a speech revealing a bit about the industry's abuses. Rev. Bentz did not speak, but voted in favor of releasing the bill. All those who voted against release were gentlemen who could talk a good game about understanding climate change, but obviously did not care enough about it to listen to the science, to their constituents, and to their consciences.

MAP will continue to stand for the preservation and care of God's Creation as dictated by Scripture (Genesis 2:15) and our own Social Principles (¶160). I hope more of you will join us. We lost valuable time by the bill failing to move forward this session. Next year, there will be even less time to waste.
