From the Desk of the Executive Director . . .

M.A.P. PARTICIPATES IN THE BREAD FOR THE WORLD ADVOCACY SUMMIT

Rev. Grant L. Johnson, Board Chairperson, Methodist Action Program

Food insecurity advocates from across the county gathered in Washington, D.C. for a time of inspiration, and education, learning effective lobbying techniques, and eventually, lobbying members on Congress on Capitol Hill. Rev. Eugene Cho, Executive Director, delivered his opening sermon from John 6:1-13, "Jesus blessed the bread and gave it to the disciples the disciples feed the people". Feeding people is clearly a part of our Christian mandate. Part of that ministry is advocating for legislation that addresses the tough issues that cause hunger both locally and globally.

Bread for the World set two legislative priorities that the summit participants would lobby their Congresspersons.

The Domestic Priority

The Domestic Priority was the extension of the Child Care Nutrition Waivers through 2022-2023 academic year. This will allow local schools to modify the program to meet their individual. The helps remove social barriers so more children can be feed. These waivers were used as a part of Covid-19 emergency relief. Continuation will removes barriers so more people can be feed.

Global Priority

- To support and cosponsor the Global Malnutrition Prevention and Treatment Act (S.2956)
- To invest \$300 million in the global nutrition account so that mothers and children can survive and thrive.

Investing in nutrition is a critical part of ending preventable death of mothers and children. Under-nutrition is responsible for almost half offender the age of five each year (nearly 3 million), ad for a large share of maternal deaths. Every dollar invested in these programs results in gains of \$18 in better productivity and decreased health care costs.

Your local church can fulfill its mission to advocate to feed hunger people by:

• Becoming informed about the issues. *Bread for the world* (bread.org) has collected the hard facts. Congress persons from across the aisle respect the knowledge and integrity of *Bread for the World* because it is effective, respectful, and thoughtful.

A church group can write letters to its congress person. Some churches sponsor "letter drops"- letters collected as an offering to God before they are mailed. People of faith with no financial agenda gets their attention. Listen to the stories of hungry people living right in your neighborhood and tell your story.

Many have experienced or can identify with hunger. We need to tell our stories.
