From the Desk of the Executive Director . . .

Many thanks to Rev. Grant Johnson for providing last week's MAP article!

This past Thursday I attend the Northeast Quarterly Meeting of the Bread for the World organization. The Northeast Director, Cheri Andes, is familiar to the MAP Board, and attended our July meeting (more on that later).

Bread for the World is an extremely well-organized advocacy group. Its programs are easy for congregations to implement in standing for food access justice and other hunger-related issues. The home page, bread.org, will lead you to a wealth of information about the organization. However, on the following page is described a means for congregations to take tangible advocacy action around both domestic and international hunger issues:

The action described on the above page is called the "Offering of Letters," and it has been extremely effective in advocacy campaigns. Please consider whether your own congregation would be willing to participate.

In addition, individuals may use the Bread for the World action network links to send emails to their own representatives concerning domestic and global food access justice issues through the TAKE ACTION buttons on same page (scroll down). There is no "take action" button for the Farm Bill, but you can find a wealth of information about the impact of the bill by clicking the LEARN MORE button. I encourage you to become familiar with this information. When an action button becomes available, you then will be well-informed.

At the recent MAP Board meeting, Cheri Andes announced that Bread for the World is looking for a new generation of Pen-Del clergy who would like to be trained in bringing justice ministries to their congregations. Please contact Rev. Grant Johnson at Immanuel UMC Townsend or Cheri Andes at Bread for the World for more information.

Also, I want to include a brief note about the upcoming primary and general elections. Please take the time to become familiar with the views of the candidates before voting. Anyone of voting age who is not yet registered should now be able to register and vote on the same day, thanks to legislation recently passed by the General Assembly. In addition, Vote by Mail legislation was passed; both bills are awaiting the governor's signature at this writing. More information will be forthcoming.
